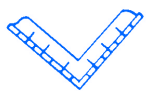


Master's Message

“We as Speculative Masons must also make use of our tools to more and glorious purposes. Inspect your tools, examine them closely. Is your Gauge divided equally? Is your Gavel cracked? Is your Plumb Line swaying? Is your Square true with the Square of Virtue and your Level as even as time? Pay particular attention to your Trowel. If there be an ulterior motive or hidden desire as we attempt to spread the cement of Brotherly Love and affection, it will be like a burr on the blade of a trowel and will mar or nullify any good intentions.”
